

# Frogs & Toads

### **Learning outcomes**

- » Students know the sequential stages of life cycles are different for different animals, such as butterflies, frogs, and mice. (Grade 2 Life Sciences)
- » Students know that organisms reproduce offspring of their own kind and that the offspring resemble their parents and one another. (Grade 2 – Life sciences)
- » Students know different plants and animals inhabit different kinds of environments and have external features that help them thrive in different kinds of places. (Grade 1 Life sciences)

#### Activities we did

- » We listened to different frog calls from the following website: http://animaldiversity.ummz.umich.edu/site/top-ics/frogCalls.html
- » We examined frog and toad specimens and talked about the differences and similarities between the two.

## **Today's craft: Frog Finger Puppet**



#### You will need:

- » Frog puppet template (included)
- » Green, yellow, orange or tan felt
- » Scissors

- » Tacky glue
- » Googly eyes
- » Black markers

#### Directions:

- 1. Print out the frog puppet template and cut out the pieces. Use them to trace the parts on the felt and cut them out.
- 2. Glue the two frog body pieces together along three sides; leave an opening on one of the shorter ends for your finger.
- 3. Glue the frog feet to the bottom of the body on the front.
- 4. Glue the googly eyes to the body towards the top. You can cut a small divot in between the eyes if you want.
- 5. Draw a mouth and nostrils on the frog using the black marker.
