



Peek-a-boo Pangolin

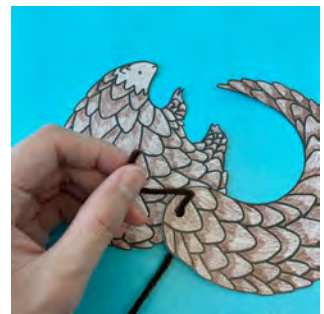
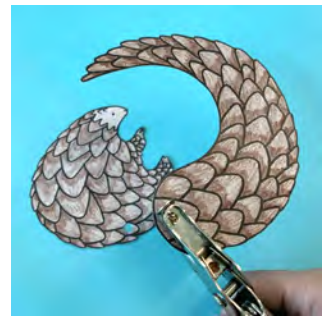
Pangolins, often called scaly anteaters, have their own set of built-in armor. Large scales made of keratin (the same material as your fingernails and toenails) cover their bodies. When threatened, pangolins curl themselves into a ball for protection, and can use their tail's curling ability to climb trees. Despite their impressive armor, pangolins are critically endangered. Materials

Pangolin template (page 2)
Colored pencils, crayons, or markers
Scissors
Hole puncher or sharpened pencil
Yarn or string

Directions

1. **Print** pangolin template on page 2.
2. **Color** your pangolin.
3. **Cut** out your pangolin.
4. **Punch** 2 holes, 1 on the body and 1 on the tail.
If you don't have a hole puncher, use a sharpened pencil.
5. **Attach** your pangolin's tail to the body using a piece of yarn or string. Make sure the tail is on top.
6. **Curl** your pangolin up into a ball.
Now you can withstand the bite of a lion!
